In December of 2022, the NCSBN Board of Directors voted to uphold the passing standard of -0.18 logits, which will remain in effect through March 31, 2026. A logit is a measurement to report relative differences between candidate ability estimates and item difficulties. Data is based on aggregate results from National Council of State Boards of Nursing and may contain errors due to miscoding candidates. Current pass rates should be obtained from the program directly.
