All pass rates are for first-time candidates taking the NCLEX registered nursing (RN) exam. Schools represented are those offering registered nursing (RN) programs-either an Associate Degree in Nursing or a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). The NCLEX-RN national passing standard will remain at the current level of 0.00 logits that was instituted April 1, 2016 and will remain in effect through March 31, 2022. A logit is a measurement to report relative differences between candidate ability estimates and item difficulties. Data is based on aggregate results from National Council of State Boards of Nursing and may contain errors due to miscoding candidates. Current pass rates should be obtained from the program directly.
